The IMPRS-ESM strives to attract a diversity of talented men and women from all nationalities to research in the Earth system sciences. The PhD program is open to applicants holding a German Diplom degree or the equivalent (e.g., Masters degree with written thesis) in physics, geophysical sciences (incl. meteorology and oceanography), chemistry, ecology, mathematics, computer science, engineering, or economics.

To apply, please complete the IMPRS-ESM online registration and subsequently submit the requested documents via e-mail. Online registration closes March 15, 2011. The selection procedure includes an interview. Doctoral students receive financial support of about 1,300 Euros/month for a period of 3 years. There are no tuition fees for PhD students (however, there University applies some administrative charges).
