### **Purpose**


 issue of increasing importance, especially in the context of anthropogenic global climate change







possible impacts of sea-level rise:






→ from our recent experience from communicating with regional stakeholders it has become very clear that this issue must be considered a major issue for stakeholders and the public at large.

## **Particular Aspects**

#### for example ...

- •Are satellite-altimeter observations already useful for the study of Baltic Sea level variability?
- •Are there new efforts made in the development of advanced geodetic techniques for measuring vertical land movement at tide gauges?
- Which available input data are used up to date by coastal engineers for hydrodynamic or sediment transport models?
- ■Which sea-level data are available for the Baltic Sea research community, and which of the data have been quality controlled by peer-reviewed scientific studies?
- •Which climatic data were used so far for studying the climatic influence on sea level in the Baltic Sea? Has full advantage been made of existing data?
- Is there a need for more cross-national studies?
- •What are the challenges for future Baltic Sea level research?
- ■What is known? What is very likely? And what is still uncertain?




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### Sea level in BONUS

- BONUS analysed scientific output from Baltic Sea research during 2002-2006 (based on a total of 1,975 papers in ISI-ranked journals taken from 15 databases)
- → 18 references related to sea-level change in the Baltic (excluding findings from paleo-research)
- → there of 9 references in BACC




#### **Total Publications per Year 2002-2006 (peer-reviewed)**



Publications 1947-2009 (total; percent)



#### **Total Publications per Year 1987-2009**




#### **Publication Overview (total; percent)**




#### **Nationality (first or co-authors)**


#### What comes next?



 literature research (due to internet, libraries, requests, personal communications to authors etc)

→ **143 publications** (preliminary Nov 09)

→final result of literature research will be implemented in BALTEX Publication Library, detectable via keyword 'sea level'



- overview report, summarizing the available knowledge about sea-level variability and change in the Baltic Sea region (until winter 2010)
- possibly → implementation of detected sea level change related questions in the SURBACC survey (collaboration with D. Bray)




The issue of sea level in the Baltic Sea appears relatively less represented in the BACC report (2008) compared to other aspects of climate change, as it is not included in the overall summary.

### Sea Level in BACC

Sea level is a sub-sections of the BACC I 'Baltic Sea Section'

It is planned to be 'upgraded' in BACC II to stay as a separate section parallel on the 'Baltic Sea Section'.
